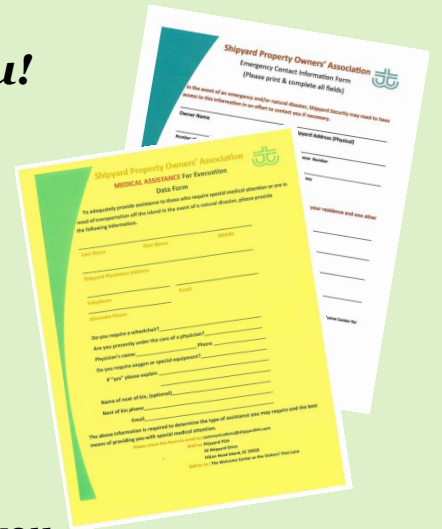

Thanks for helping us help you in the event of an emergency. We really want to do everything we can to keep you informed and safe, so we would appreciate your help. Thanks, and hopefully we will have little to no storm activity to worry about this season.
