I hope you are all having a great summer so far. Here are just a few reminders for the rest of the season:

- \* Starting on August 13, 2022, the beach staff will start returning to school. The Beach Shuttle will run on Saturdays and Sundays ONLY until Labor Day weekend.
- \* Beach hangtags are required through Labor Day weekend. Make sure to display them in your vehicle correctly.
- \* If you have hurricane shutters, they can be installed when a hurricane watch is issued for the Hilton Head area. Hurricane shutters may not be installed and left on your home for the entire hurricane season. They shall be removed as soon as possible after a storm has passed and re-entry into Shipyard is permitted.
- \* Please be mindful of our alligator population. Most alligators have a healthy fear of humans. Please report any concerning alligator activity to Shipyard Security, (843) 785 - 4776. If found to be aggressive, the alligator will be removed and euthanized. Please do not allow your children or pets to venture near a lagoon without proper adult supervision. Exercise caution and common sense.
- \* Make note of this special phone number that has been set up for Shipyard residents and keep it with you, **(843) 415 - 7789**. This number is to dispense hurricane evacuation information as well as re-entry information. Being prepared is key. ### MORE HURRICANE INFO.

Shipyard's emergency phone number is **(843) 415 - 7789**. Please jot this number down and keep it with your evacuation kit. Also, if you are not already on our email blast communication system, please sign up for this service. You can request to be added to the list calling or emailing the Communications Coordinator (843) 785-3310 ext. 1001 or [communications@shipyardhhi.com](mailto:communications@shipyardhhi.com).

Emails have served us well during past hurricanes and evacuations, when many other forms of communication were down and offline.

Now is the time to organize and prepare for the possibility of evacuation. In the unlikely event of an evacuation, remember that services may be out of service upon your return. Stocking up on non-perishable foods and stockpiling bottled water supplies are important precautions in case services are offline.

If you have mapped out a different evacuation route for you and your family, you must leave before the governor calls a mandatory evacuation; otherwise, you will be forced to use the outlined evacuation routes.

There are a few different vehicles that the crew at Hilton Head Island Fire & Rescue use in uncertain weather conditions or hazards (hurricanes, flooding, etc.). A **Quint Fire Engine** is a multi-faceted vehicle with a ladder truck and water-pumping fire engine combined. It can hold more than 300 gallons of water and a ladder taller than 85 feet. "Quint" refers to the five functions of the vehicle - pump, water tank, fire hose, aerial device, and ground ladders. A **Pumper Fire Engine** has one mission: to put out the fire. With their permanently mounted fire pump at 750 gpm, it can accomplish the task with ease. The fire department is often aided by **Emergency Medical Services (EMS)**. This team usually consists of two people, one to drive and one to look after the patient in the back.

**Reminder:** South Carolina law requires all drivers to move over to the non-adjacent lane when passing emergency vehicles that are stopped on the side of the road with emergency lights on, or slow down if moving over is not an option.
