### Primary Impacts:

- Coastal flooding; dangerous storm surge inundation possible Locally heavy rainfall, mainly Thursday and Thursday night Isolated tornadoes possible Thursday into Friday

- Dangerous marine conditions
- Beach erosion, dangerous surf and rip currents
- Tropical storm force winds/wind gusts, especially near the coast and across Atlantic waters












### Situation Overview

After landfall in Florida, Nicole still expected to recurve toward the northeast late week.

### Watches/Warnings/Advisories


- Tropical Storm Warning for Berkeley County and for all coastal counties and Atlantic coastal waters including **Charleston Harbor**
- Storm Surge Watch remains in effect for coast from Altamaha Sound to South Santee River
- High Surf Advisory for entire coast

### Tropical Storm Watches have been upgraded to Tropical Storm Warnings on land







#### Main Threat Area:

- Close to the coast and perhaps well inland
- Highest winds/gusts along the immediate coast


### Main Threat Timing:

- Coastal Areas: Today into Friday
- Inland: Late Thursday into Friday as Nicole passes over or west of this area

### Main Potential Impacts:

- Scattered trees down and power outages
- Some minor property damage
- **Additional Potential Impact** Statements














# Storm Surge Threat & Potential Impacts

#### Last Updated: 11/9/2022 5:15 AM

#### Main Threat Area:

Tidally-influenced areas across our entire SC and GA coast

#### Main Threat Timing:

Today through Friday, especially during the morning high tide cycles

#### Main Potential Impacts:

- Dangerous storm surge inundation is possible
- Significant coastal flooding of roads/properties is likely
- Moderate to major beach erosion due to elevated tides and high surf
- **Additional Potential Impact Statements**


<u>NOTE:</u> Several rounds of elevated tides are likely (even during times of low astronomical tides) causing extended periods of flooding






# Flooding Rainfall Threat & Potential Impacts

### Main Threat Area:

Along the coast and along/west of I-95

### Main Threat Timing:

Heaviest rainfall expected Thursday afternoon into Friday

### Main Potential Impacts:

- Significant flooding of lowlying/poorly drained areas
- Heavy rain close to the times of high tide could exacerbate coastal flooding
- Additional Potential Impact **Statements**
















#### Last Updated: 11/9/2022 5:15 AM

- Storm Total rainfall forecast valid through Saturday
  - 2-3 inches likely most areas, with some areas along/west of I-95 3-4 inches. Local amounts around 5 inches possible
- Rain could be heavy at times causing at least minor flooding of low-lying and poorly drained areas
- Flooding could be enhanced in tidal urban areas like Downtown Charleston if heavy rain occurs around the times of high tide Thursday into Friday











# Tornado Threat & Potential Impacts

#### Main Threat Area:

- The SC Lowcountry and GA Coastal Empire, especially closer to the coast
- The overall threat has increased since the previous Advisory


#### Main Threat Timing:

Thursday night into Friday

#### Main Potential Impacts:


- Isolated damage to trees, power lines and mobile homes
- Isolated power outages
- Additional Potential Impact Statements

<u>NOTE</u>: Tropical tornadoes are typically weak and short-lived and thus may occur with little to no warning.


















**Tropical Storm Nicole**

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- Confidence that Nicole will produce impacts here is HIGH Confidence in type and extent of impacts varies by hazard and location
- Tropical storm force winds/gusts could produce minor tree and structural damage today through Friday, especially near the coast through late week and/or within any tropical rain bands that move farther inland
- Moderate to major coastal flooding likely, especially during the morning high tides today through Friday.
- Locally heavy rainfall flooding and at least minor flooding of poorly drained areas are possible Thursday
